

PPE Printing Project

Working with the community

In late March, we were asked by Amita Health Adventist Medical Centers to make protective face shields on our 3-D printer. Without hesitation, we said yes and asked School District 181 and area libraries to join the force. By utilizing an open-source code of a hospital approved design for the shield, we were even able to ask community members who owned 3-D printers for their assistance, too. Over 500 face shields have been printed and distributed to local healthcare workers and hospitals!

As you know, all due dates are currently being extended and no fines are accruing on items you may have checked out earlier this spring.

In April, the Board approved a change to the Library's Circulation Policy to eliminate overdue fines altogether.

Effective immediately, we will not charge for overdue items. We still need our items back, of course! So, borrowing privileges will be suspended after items are 14 days overdue. (But, remember, we have automatic renewals—so you get even more time with the items you check out!)



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


