In early July, the Hinsdale Public Library reopened its doors to patrons. It had been 115 days-nearly four months-since we closed the building to the public. These resources are a great place to start most research, covering a variety of topics from legal and business topics to consumer health and auto repair. Among them are also robust general resources, like Masterfile and Academic Search Premier for researching almost any topic whether for personal interest or school projects. Students will find resources designed with their needs and developmental stages in mind with Primary Search Plus for elementary school students and Middle Search Plus for middle school students.
