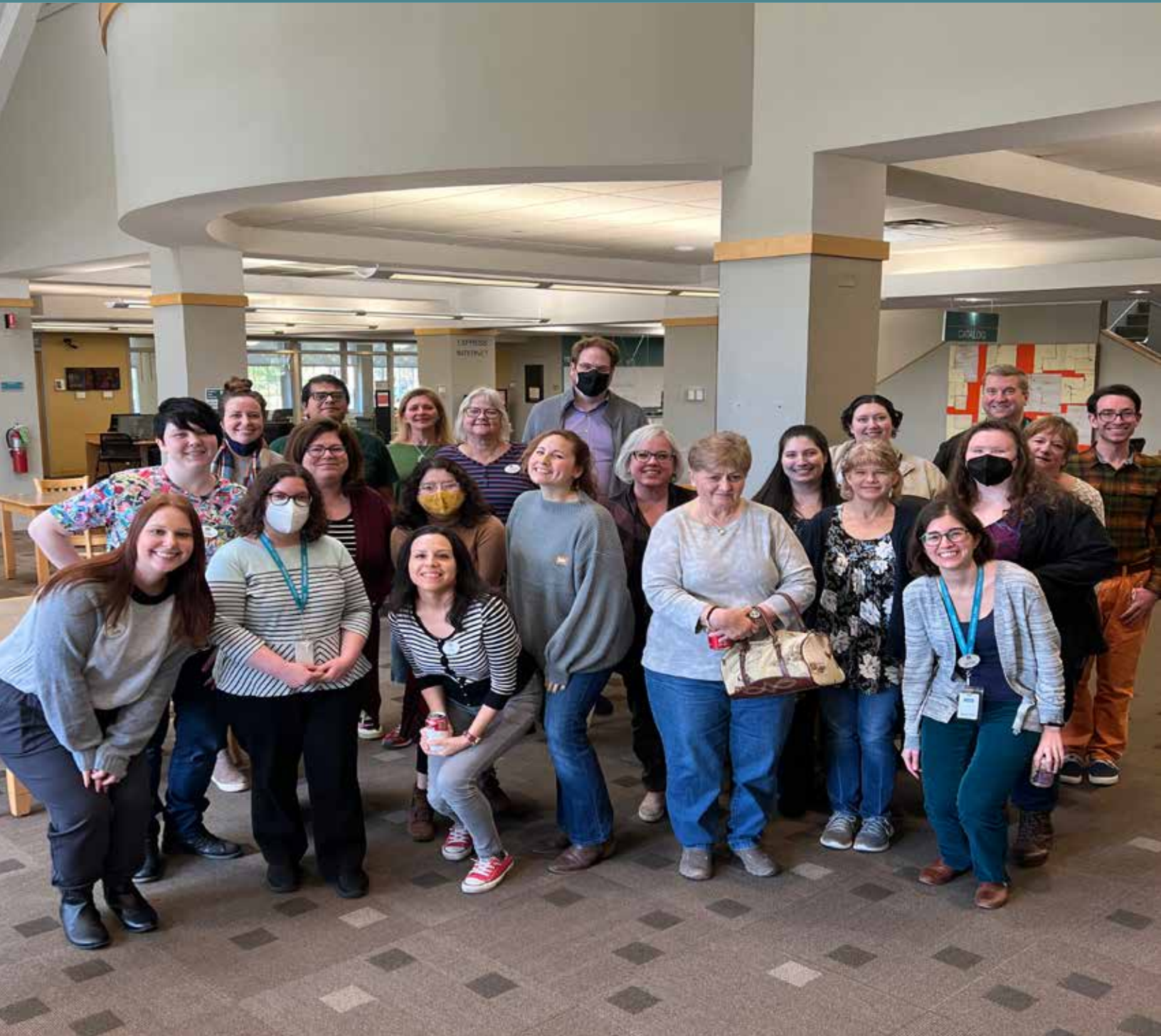

Winter Art Exhibit: Art Science and the Elegant Universe

By Lindsay Olson

Lindsay's artistic practice grows out of an intense curiosity about the ways our society is supported by science and technology. She has worked as Fermi National Accelerator's first artist in residence, at CERN (the European Organization for Nuclear Research) in Switzerland, and the Chicago Botanic Garden among other notable organizations. Her work is currently touring in Europe and has been shown nationally from The Field Museum to the University of New Hampshire. Lindsay taught in the Fashion Studies Department at Columbia College Chicago for over 20 years and is currently serving as the first artist in residence with The Wetlands Initiative.

In this exhibit, Lindsay uses her training to create art about the hidden realities of our world. Medieval Illuminated Manuscripts, ancient, jewel-like objects, inspired her to communicate the exciting research being conducted at Fermilab and around the world through art.

Emigration from Europe: Ports of Departure: A Genealogy Class

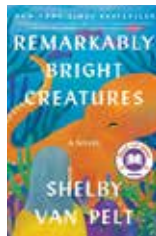

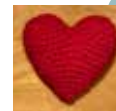
