

Rachel Weaver Rivera is a professional artist and mental health therapist. She is a frequent presenter on the connections between creativity, mental health, and learning. Rachel has taught art at organizations including the Kensington Arts Center in La Grange, the Hyde Park Art Center, the Evanston Art Center, Quinn Community Center in Maywood, and the John Michael Kohler Art Center in Sheboygan, WI. She is a member of the Oak Park and La Grange Art Leagues.

In Her Words:

I grew up in Hinsdale between 1970 and 1977, and as fate and fortune would have it, in 2022, I had the opportunity to return.

It was no surprise to me that even after all these years, Hinsdale still feels like home. After moving back, as an artist, I found myself wanting to visually reflect on the places I remembered from my childhood. Additionally, I wanted to explore the idea of "coming home" and what the feeling of "being at home" truly means. I wondered how Hinsdale shaped who I have become.

In this show, I present my Hinsdale in a dual, ever-evolving context of then and now. I worked in the medium of phototransfer collage. My small intimate pieces and the layered process in which I created them are meant to evoke a feeling of preciousness and wistfulness about the passage of time.






