

Hoopla boasts on-demand streaming-you always check out instantly—it may take a few months or more for the most popular titles to be added to the platform. Hoopla also offers comics, music, and movies, including MasterClass titles.

Kanopy has a large library of ondemand video streaming. Kanopy users can access the Criterion Collection, Great Courses, and award-winning documentaries.






